



AUTISM ORGANIZATIONS

SCLARC

The South Central Los Angeles Regional Center (SCLARC) is a nonprofit agency that provides services and supports to individuals with developmental disabilities in the South Central Los Angeles area. SCLARC serves individuals with intellectual disabilities, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism, and other similar conditions.

Some of the services and supports that SCLARC offers include:

- 1. Assessment and diagnosis of developmental disabilities
- 2. Development of individualized service plans
- 3. Referral to and coordination of services such as education, therapy, and employment support
- 4. Advocacy and support for individuals and their families
- 5. Information and training on available resources and services.
- 6. Assistance with transition planning for young adults moving from school to adult services

SNN

The Special Needs Network (SNN) in Los Angeles offers a range of therapy services and programs for individuals with special needs. Some of the services and programs they offer include:

Behavioral Therapy

SNN provides behavioral therapy services, including Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), for individuals with autism and other developmental disabilities. This therapy focuses on improving behaviors, communication skills, social interactions, and daily living skills.

Mental Health Counseling

MOVIE THEATERS

AMC Theatres

AMUSEMENT PARKS

Knott's Berry Farm

Knott's Berry Farm in Buena Park, near Los Angeles, offers a Boarding Pass Program for guests with disabilities, including special needs. The program allows individuals with disabilities to access attractions through an alternate entrance and receive accommodations as needed.

Six Flags Magic Mountain

Six Flags Magic Mountain in Valencia, north of Los Angeles, provides a Guest Assistance Pass for guests with disabilities, including special needs. The pass allows individuals with disabilities to access attractions through alternative entrances and receive accommodations based on their needs.

Legoland California Resort

SWIMMING

The LA84 Foundation Adaptive Aquatics Program

Special Olympics Southern California Aquatics
